## What is EPA's Endangered Species Protection Program (ESPP)?

- Endangered Species Act (ESA)
  - Passed in 1973
  - Purpose: to protect threatened and endangered species
  - Species cannot be harmed, pursued, hunted, transported or traded
  - Fish and Wildlife Service = oversight
  - Other federal agencies also need to protect threatened and endangered species
