Hot and Hotter

We just got back from Wing Ding a couple of weeks ago,... and boy, was it hot!! Triple digit temperatures on the Sunday before Wing Ding kicked off, and now it's a week of the high 90's back home. Wing Ding was a blast! The Gaylord Opryland Hotel complex had a "Wow "factor that still hasn't worn off. Robin and I bought "cool vests" a couple of weeks prior to our trip to Nashville, suspecting that the heat might be a factor. These vests work on the principle of evaporative cooling. After wetting the vests down and putting them on, the air flows through the outer layer of nylon, evaporates moisture in the inner layers and cools the vest itself down to a temperature between 20 to 30 degrees below the ambient air temperature, depending on humidity levels and such

Our particular models have a water proof lining so that our shirts don't become soaked in the process. Riding on a 95+ degree day now is a pure joy, wearing our vests under our nylon mesh riding jackets. We've already used our cooling vests more than we've used our electric heated vests this past winter. Between the cool vests and drinking plenty of water, our riding has been safe and fun.

We've just had the Chapter A-2 3rd Annual Camping/Cook Out at Willville Motorcycle Campground, and now Robin and I will be off to Fletcher for the Wings Over the Smokies planning meeting .

We're both encouraged by all the A-2 Members who have volunteered to work with us again this year. I know that with your help, we'll make this one of the best Wings Over the Smokies ever.

12 Myths Part 2



Myth 4: Helmets Block Your Ability to See or Hear Danger

The thing you learn when you dig into the research is that motorcycle riders who use helmets crash less frequently than those who don't. Maybe that happens because motorcyclists who decide to wear helmets have a better or more realistic attitude about riding. Maybe it's because putting on a helmet is a reminder that what you are about to do can be dangerous and the act of accepting protection puts you in the right mindset. Maybe it's because a helmet provides eye protection and cuts down wind noise so you can actually see and hear better. Maybe it's because, by cutting wind pressure and noise, a helmet reduces fatigue. Whatever the reasons, wearing a helmet clearly does not increase a motorcyclist's risk of having an accident and wearing one correlates to reduced likelihood of an accident.

Myth 5: A Helmet Won't Help in Most Crashes

People look at the seemingly low impact speeds used in motorcycle-helmet testing and assume that if you are going faster than that, the helmet will no longer be up to the job. That ignores a few critical facts:

- . Most accidents happen at relatively low speeds.
- Most of the impact energy is usually vertical-the distance your head falls until it hits.
- Helmets (or at least helmets that meet DOT standards) perform spectacular life-saving feats at impact speeds far above those used in testing.
- When a helmeted rider suffers a fatal head injury, it frequently doesn't matter, because, to hit hard enough to sustain that fatal injury, he sustained multiple additional fatal injuries to other parts of his body. In other words, the fact that the helmet didn't prevent the head injury was of no consequence.
- The numbers clearly say that riders using DOT helmets simply survive crashes more successfully than those without them. Myth 6: A Helmet Will Leave You Brain damaged in a Crash When You Would Have Simply Died

Of course that's possible—your helmet attenuates the impact energy enough to keep the injury from being fatal but not enough to keep all of your eggs from getting scrambled. However, that's rare, and if you hit that hard, you are likely to get killed by some other injury. It's actually the un-helmeted rider who is likely to cross from animal to vegetable kingdom, and often from a relatively minor impact that would have damaged nothing but his ego if he'd been wearing a DOT helmet.

Myth 7: A Skilled Rider Should Be Able to Handle Almost Any Situation

The sharpest, most skilled motorcyclist in the world isn't going to be up to the task when a car turns or pulls out in front of him a short distance ahead and stops directly in his path broadside. Believing that your superior skills will keep you of trouble is a pipe dream, even if they are as good as you think. No matter how skilled you are, it's better to ride to avoid situations that can turn ugly. Slow down, scan farther ahead, and think strategically. And Dress for the crash. Helmet, gloves, over the ankle boots, and long sleeve shirt or jacket.

It's summer time, lots of heat and what else – thunderstorms, complete with lightning. We all know how lightning can kill, but many motorists and motorists think that as long as you keep going, you can safely out-run the storm : Read below:

"Lightning strike kills motorcyclist on highway"

(Associated Press)

Westminster, Colorado – A motorcyclist died after apparently being struck by lightning while riding in rush hour traffic on a highway between Denver and Boulder, police said.

Witnesses reported seeing a flash of light shortly before the motorcyclist struck the highway's center concrete divider, Westminster police spokesman Tim Read said in a statement.

The man, whose name was not released, was pronounced dead at the scene Wednesday. His motorcycle came to rest about 150 meters from where lightning blasted an 18-by-8-inch crater 4 inches deep that blew chunks of asphalt across the highway and slightly damaged other vehicles. THE MAN WAS WEARING A HELMET.

This is not a unique case. In the spring of 2006, lightning struck a motorcyclist in the Norfolk, Virginia area, killing him. The best advice is to wait out the storm until it has completely passed by. It's much better to get to your destination alive, than to get to your destination on time. Please think about that as you ride this summer.

A question in the Work Bench section of the latest edition of Wing World addressed the use of E85 fuel in Gold Wings. Stu Oltman noted that Gold Wings are not compatible and could not be "adjusted" to use this fuel! An older article by Howard Halasz pointed out that ethanol can damage O rings, seals and expensive throttle slides in the carbs.

Honda recommends no more than 10% ethanol content in the fuel. E85 contains 85% ethanol and 15% gasoline. Gasahol has 10% ethanol and 90% gasoline.


