Competitive ORC students attended the RowOntario Championships in Welland, home of the South Niagara Rowing Club. This two day Provincial Regatta was attended by rowing clubs from all over the province including University clubs as well as exhibition participation from the Provincial and Junior National teams.

The 2000m course was hot and windy on Saturday, with a strong tail wind on Sunday as well as light rain showers to cool things off.

The Orillia Rowing Club had 9 students participating in six events with 2 boats making the finals.

In the Under 17 Women's single, Sarah Pidgen rowed "On the Fly" to a 3rd in her heat and, in the finals, 4th place - just 1.5 seconds behind the bronze medal boat. The women's Under 17 Double of Pidgen and Kirsten Cameron rowed hard in the Kaschper for 3rd in their heat and 4th in the final.

Under 17 Men of Tim Herd and Noah Schaefer had a strong row in the Kaschper to finish a close 4<sup>th</sup> place. The Under 19 doubles crew of Herd and Stephen Scott finished 6th.

Rowing the RCA pair were Under 19 Women of Laura MacIver and Steph Duquette who had a strong row and were cut off in the last 500m but still finished in 5th position. The Under 19 Women coxed 4 crew of Duquette, Tyhme Thompson, Kitrina Typhair, MacIver and coxie Herd had a great race in the Ashleigh to finish 5th.

#### **ORC Henley Results**

The Orillia Rowing Club was proud to be represented at the 123rd Royal Canadian Henley Regatta in St. Catharines this year by 9 student rowers and 4 adults. This week long international event brought participants from all over Canada, the United States, Mexico and elsewhere. Some of Orillia's athletes raced under some of the hottest conditions this summer with the humidex topping the 44degree mark.

Sarah Pidgen kept her cool while rowing her single, On the Fly, to finish the 2000m course1st in her heat and finished 4th in the semi-final.

In double sculls Junior Women, Pidgen and Kirsten Cameron rowed against tough competition to place 3rd in their heat just a second behind to qualify for the semi's. Under 19 Men of Tim Herd and Noah Schaefer had a clean row and finished 6th while the Under 19 Mens crew of Herd and Stephen Scott had a strong row but could not hold on to their 3rd place spot due to weedy interference, to finish a close 5th.



Rowing RCA in the Womens Under 19 Pairs event Laura MacIver and Stephanie Duquette had a strong straight row to finish 4th in their heat while the coxed 4 crew of Duquette, Tyhme Thompson, Kitrina Typhair, MacIver and coxie Cameron rowed Ashleigh to finish 6th.

Orillia Masters had a good showing on the 1000m Henley course. Barb Pidgen sculled her On the Fly single to place 3rd in her heat and finalled to 5th place while Pidgen and Vera Cameron vanAmelsvoort rowed the RCA double to 5th place in their heat. Mens doubles crew of Bob Wink and Brad Ingleton rowed Gold Barr for a 3rd place finish in their heat and finalled to 5th place.
