## LOT OWNER'S RELATIVE PRAISES OUR SUPERINTENDENT FOR HIS COURTESY, CARE AND SERVICE

What a joy it was to read an e-mail from a relative of a lot owner buried earlier this year at our beloved cemetery. It did my heart good having so much praise bestowed upon our superintendent Joe Connell for his assistance during the interment process. I'd like to share her sentiments with all of you, with her permission of course. Here is the e-mail I received from Eileen Phelps concerning the burial of her aunt Hulda Louise Coomes, 89.

Today was the burial of my aunt at Prospect Hill Cemetery. I found your email in the holiday newsletter and wanted to share my experience.

Having heard from family members who had visited the cemetery four years ago that it was not a nice place, we were not looking forward to our visit.

My husband works for the funeral home that was handling my aunt's burial, so we visited the cemetery yesterday to check things out. Mr. Joe Connell and his son were busy picking up tree branches from the violent wind storm on New Year's Eve. He escorted us to my aunt's grave and instructed my husband how to bring the procession into the cemetery with the easiest access to the grave.

Today Mr. Connell met us at the gate as we arrived. He was waiting for us at the top of the hill as we exited our cars; he educated us about the cemetery and answered all our questions; he provided us with contact people for engraving the marker; he kindly escorted relatives to the rest room and offered assistance with the casket. And there was not a downed tree limb to be seen!

My husband and I have been to many cemeteries and have never experienced the attention and kindness Mr. Connell gave to us. He is the reason Prospect Hill is the beautiful cemetery it is today! I believe he truly loves Prospect Hill. We can't wait to return in the spring, when it's not freezing cold, and walk the beautiful grounds.

#### FLAGS WILL AGAIN FLY OVER GRAVES OF U. S. VETERANS

As in the past, Superintendent Connell and members of our Board of Trustees will honor former United States military veterans buried in our cemetery by placing American flags on their graves for the Memorial Day weekend, May 23-25. It is a ritual similar to that at Arlington and other national cemeteries.

Many veterans' gravestones, such as those from the Civil War, give information only about military service. Others, usually in family plots, do not. To make certain we do not miss your ancestors or family members who were U. S. veterans, please mail the form on the last page of this newsletter indicating on whose grave(s) you would like flags placed.

#### PLEASE CALL FIRST AND MAKE AN APPOINTMENT

At times, folks have entered the cemetery unannounced seeking help or direction from Superintendent Connell, and found no one home. Since he is our only employee, sometimes his duties take him away from the cemetery. He suggests you call first and **make an appointment.** This way he can prepare for your visit and give you his undivided attention. He will be glad to help you in any way. #### ONLY SEVEN BURIALS WERE PERFORMED LAST YEAR

Superintendent Connell oversaw only seven burials at Prospect Hill last year, one more than in 2007. Four of the seven were the result of cremations, which require far less effort than ordinary burials. Cost for the interment of cremation ashes is also much less. Only four burial plots were sold in 2008.

Names of the deceased, ages and burial dates of their cremains:

Herta, 97, and Hugo Mueller, 93, May 13 (transfer); Lucienne Strocker, 97, November 25; Norio Shiozaki, 74, December 14.

Names of the deceased, ages and date of their ordinary burials:

Jane Irene Barclift, 89, April 28; Mary Elizabeth Schaffert, 89, May 24; Luise Opperman, 95, May 29.

Burials and the sale of plots are the main sources of income in most cemeteries. But as you can see, that is not the case at Prospect Hill. Donations are the main source. We continue to rely heavily on the generosity of our remaining lot owners as our major source of income. But you must realize the remaining living lot owners are becoming a fading family themselves.

Sadly, most of the sites at Prospect Hill have no known living owners or caretakers, so we must rely greatly on the current generation of relatives and friends for donations, and our devoted superintendent, Joe Connell, for the cemetery's upkeep.

## HER LOVE FOR HER DECEASED BROTHER LIVED ON EVEN IN HER DEATH

It was a fitting closure to true brotherly love.

Your Board of Trustees learned recently of a final wish come true for former trustee Lucienne Strocker, whose ashes were put to rest at Prospect Hill Cemetery last year.

Her only brother, Albert, who died at an early age, was Lucienne's pride and joy. She loved him so much she requested that a favorite portrait of him be burned and buried along with her so that they could remain together in death as in life. This story was revealed by one of Lucienne's close friends, Robert Leardo.

Upon her death, Lu (as she was called by friends) was 97, a native Washingtonian who graduated from Central High School in 1928 and who lived alone, a little on the reclusive side, in a rowhouse on P Street, NW, right off of Dupont Circle. She willed a sizable monetary gift to Prospect Hill Cemetery.
